Fewer new ICE registrations help avoid CO2 penalties and support used car demand





Executive Summary

New registrations of mild hybrids in Europe in the first half of the year did not offset losses of diesel (-28%) and petrol (-21%) vehicles, totalling -630,000 units.

New registrations of BEVs in Turkey grew from 8% to almost 18% of the market in the first half of the year, putting the country in fourth place overall behind Germany, the UK and France.

Diesel cars up to two years old (excluding mild hybrids) are now the smallest group in the European markets observed, accounting for 9.55% of total sales.

13.2% fewer new vans were registered in the first half of the year in Europe, mainly due to a decline in diesel (-16.5%).

In the youngest age cluster up to 2-years, the eLCV sales share has grown from 6% in 2023 to almost 10%.

Used BEVs under 2-years old improved their MDS value by almost 20 points compared to the same month last year - PHEVs by almost 16 points.

Full hybrids took the top spot among young used cars this month with an improvement of almost 13 MDS points.

This is mainly due to Asian HEVs, which is why only Toyota and Kia models are in the top 3 fastest-selling hybrids.

Price-driven rapid sales of BEVs ensure very good MDS values for the top models of just over 30, with the top combustion engine model almost 10 points higher at just under 40.

eLCVs up to 4 years old with a poor MDS value of 148.

Markets with the strongest price adjustments of 3 to 4 index points. Loss of 5-7 points in the same period last year: further weakening of the negative trend. Low inflation rate in the Eurozone of around 2% results in rather moderate margin losses.

More pronounced index losses in small countries with an above-average share of electric vehicles and large, electric-averse used car markets due to the oversupply of petrol and full hybrids.

For the middle age segment of 3 to 4 years, volume relief is not expected until 2027 due to the 'dip' in registrations in 2024.

After a price peak in Q2, the price level for LCVs is now below the level at the beginning of the year in all markets observed.

In Turkey, passenger car prices rose by just under 17 price index points, compared with inflation of 33.5% in July.

Some high-volume pickup models are achieving MDS values similar to those of passenger cars in the Turkish LCV segment, at 15-25.

The supply of young used combustion engines continues to decline

While the new car market in the EU as a whole declined by around 2% compared to the previous year, sales of young used cars actually rose slightly year-on-year. The inventory remained at the same level, suggesting the increase in sales of young used cars is being fuelled by growing supplies from tactical channels.

New registrations of diesel (-28%) and petrol (-21%) vehicles in the first half of the year were so far below the same period last year (a combined total of -630,000 units) that not even mild hybrids managed to bring their pure combustion engine counterparts back into positive territory.

This is offset by new BEVs (+22%) and PHEVs (+19.5%). In Turkey, new registrations of BEVs in the first half of the year catapulted their market

share from just under 8% in the previous year to almost 18%, putting them in fourth place overall behind Germany, the UK and France. This is a growing burden for the used car market, which is already suffering from oversupply.


In the European markets observed, young diesel cars up to two years old without mild hybrid support now make up the smallest group for the first time, at 9.55%. The situation is different in the five-year-old and older segment, where the market share of sales remains stable at just under 40%. The age distribution of sales has also been stable and unremarkable for several months. Around one third falls into the youngest group under two years old, around a quarter into the middle category of three to four years old, and

the rest into the five years and older category.


However, the individual countries show very different patterns here. For example, the UK, one of the largest used car markets, has a strikingly low share of sales of very young used cars, at less than 27%. This is mainly due to the relatively low number of combustion engines, especially diesel engines. The picture is somewhat different for light commercial vehicles, given the CO2 reduction targets that also apply here.

A 13.2% decline in new vans in the first half of the year in Europe, mainly caused by the decline in the dominant diesel segment (-16.5%), is also having an impact on the used van market. In the youngest age cluster of up to two years, the sales share has grown from just under 6% in 2023 to almost 10% now.

MDS values return to normal levels after a temporary spike


After peaking in June, the ratio of demand and supply for used cars in Europe has returned to average levels, which represents an improvement in the long term, particularly for electric vehicles. Young battery-electric models less than two years old improved their MDS value by almost 20 points on average compared with the same month last year, and PHEVs by almost 16 points.

Full hybrids even managed to improve by almost 13 points to take the top spot among young used cars this month. They have long been at the top of the rankings for mid-life used cars, but this applies primarily to models from Asian manufacturers Toyota and Kia. Accordingly, only their models are in the top 3 of the hybrid category of the fastest-selling cars.

The Tesla Model 3 remains Europe's best-selling BEV. The brand's decline in new registrations in the first half of the year within Europe of one third or -44% within the EU nevertheless kept its two main models, the 3 and Y, at the top of the used car market. Rapid sales, driven by favourable used car prices, ensure excellent MDS values of just over 30 on average, while the top combustion engine value of the MG HS is almost 10 points higher at just under 40 and that of the two other top-selling electric cars, the ID.3 and ID.4, is around 60. The value for fully electric light commercial vehicles is currently 148 for vans up to four years old, which is completely uneconomical.

The top 10 best-selling models in this age segment all achieve an average value in the triple digits. Only the ID.Buzz slips just below the 100 mark at 95.5. However, there are two markets where the VW model has moderate values, such as Germany (67.5), where it is even 14 points better than its combustion engine sibling, the VW Transporter, and the UK (57.5), where diesel vans achieve an average value of around 70.

Used car margins weighed down by falling prices and inflation

The European markets, which have seen the sharpest price adjustments so far this year, are showing an average price decline of 3 to 4 index points. Compared with the same period last year, which saw losses of 5-7 points, this represents a further weakening of the negative trend and the necessary price adjustments. Together with the relatively low inflation rate in the Eurozone of around 2%, this results in rather moderate margin losses.


Due to the still more severe index losses in small countries with an above-average share of electric vehicles, markets such as Denmark, the Netherlands and Belgium are particularly affected, while in the large, more electric-averse used car markets of Italy and Poland, the oversupply of petrol and full hybrid vehicles is

currently the problem. In both cases, volume relief for the 3- to 4-year-old segment is not expected until 2027, taking into account the dip in European registration statistics in 2024.


Turkey remains inflation-driven. However, growth in asking prices has been well below the inflation rate for some time. Currently, an increase of just over 17 index points in used car prices contrasts with a price increase rate of 33.5% in July.

However, the latter fell for the 14th month in a row and currently stands at 1.5-2% month-on-month, compared with average monthly growth in used car prices of 1.1%. One reason for this is that, with an average value of 31, the top three fast sellers in Turkey have MDS values of 10-15, and the best-selling models are all below 30.



Retail Price (weighted. avg.) Index 100 = Jan - AT, BE, DK, NE, PT, SE








Sales Market Share by Month and Fuel Type - Austria


